Residential Experiences:

During the summer term 2011, we ran 3 residential experiences: Trewern Outdoor Education and Life skills week, Mersea PMLD / PI week and FEC week in Wales. These trips offered places to pupils and students across the Upper and Middle Phases of school with a wide range of needs.

The Trewern trip has been developed over the last two years to include a broader range of abilities so that those needing support with independence and life skills can be supported to do so in a safe and appropriate setting. The staff at the centre have been keen to develop this aspect of residential experiences too and have adapted activities to match the needs of our pupils, as they always do.

The trip to Mersea offered those pupils with physical difficulties the opportunity to stay away from home in adapted caravans, whilst accessing leisure activities and social settings we all enjoy when away on holiday. Each pupil whose needs could be supported by the facilities available at the holiday park has been offered a place, starting with those in the FEC first to ensure all have an opportunity before leaving Trinity. This year we took pupils from years 10 down to year 6.

The FEC trip to Wales continued to be very popular with the students and, like last year, has students attending who are supported financially by the Disadvantage Subsidy funding received by Trinity. This money also supported places for pupils going to Trewern and the transport to get them there. Without this funding, the cost of the trips would be too high for many of our families to afford. However, we are unsure as to whether this will be available again after this academic year.
